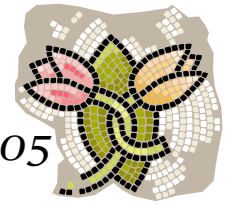
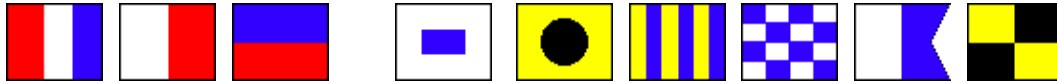

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## A signal from the Commodore.

Having spent last Sunday on a Committee Boat on Carsington Water for the 420 Winter Championships, with a Force 5 and wind chill factor giving a temperature of  $-4^{\circ}$ , and looking out of the train window as I write this at falling snow, I find it difficult to focus on the sailing season ahead. But in truth, it's not that far off. The Dinghy Show at Ally Pally, the end of our winter work parties, then an early Easter, and we are into our new season.

There has been some great maintenance work over the winter. Thanks to Martin, we have been able to achieve some big outdoor tasks such as clearing the remains of the old pontoon, digging out a new path to the sailability pontoon, grading the beach, removing old fencing and stakes, and widening the car park. Inside the club, Harry has done an outstanding job on repainting the male changing room, and the main club room is being redecorated at present. We have also replaced the fence between the club house and the boat park gate.

Besides the main club website, Charlotte has put much effort into creating a website specifically for youth

Club duties are part of this. If you have been allocated a duty, please do either do it, or arrange a substitute. It is your fellow members who suffer if you don't!

Turning to the immediate future, don't forget the “March Wednesdays” – evening social events with a theme, starting at 7:30pm on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>.

With the new website we have a new URL (web address) which is

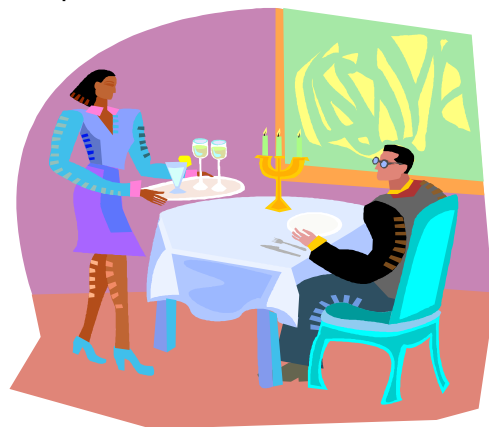

## Sportsman's Dinner

Derbyshire Youth Sailing (DYS) is the county organisation for promoting youth sailing – it is entirely volunteer based and gets no external funding of any sort. Basically, it relies on the efforts of the 10 individual sailing clubs in Derbyshire, and provides a range of training and racing events, as well as being the organiser for representative county teams – last year, for example, Derbyshire won the prestigious Mount Haes Trophy at a National competition. DYS is also the authority for awarding County Sailing Colours.

As a fund raising activity, it is holding a “Sportsman's Dinner” at Pride Park, on Thursday, March 17<sup>th</sup>, at which the guest speaker will be the former England Goalkeeper, Peter Shilton. Most of the tickets are being aimed at companies and corporate sponsors, but each of the

Derbyshire Sailing Clubs is being offered a table (10 places) at a discount rate of £25 per head.

A number of events ran at the club will rely on volunteers to do additional duties to cover these events, wherever you see volunteers required this is the case.

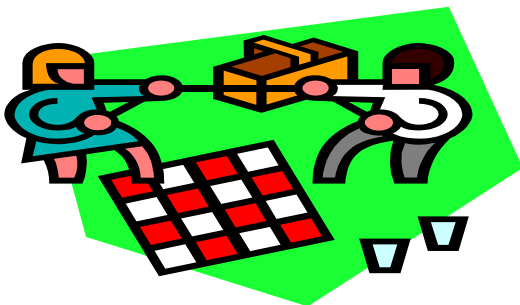
Nearer each date a sheet will go up in the clubhouse to volunteer for these events.

## Picnic and Play Days

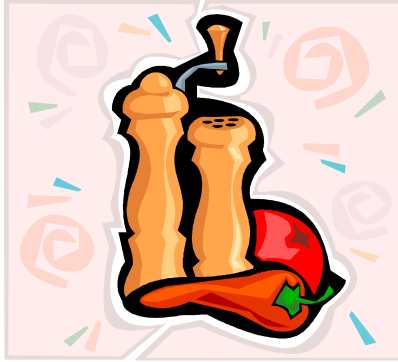
After the success of the picnic and play days last year this year we have decided to formally introduce them to the sailing calendar and increase the number. These are fun days when the club rescue

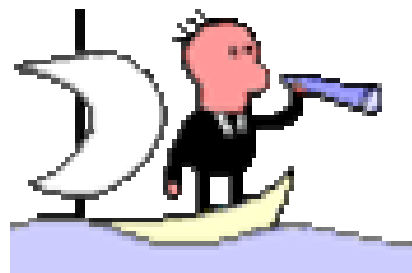
